

At the present time, the City of Minot imposes a 2% sales, use, and gross receipts tax. Effective October 1, 2026, the City of Minot has adopted an ordinance to increase its city sales, use, and gross receipts tax by 0.5%. The tax rate for Minot starting October 1, 2026, will be 2.5%. The following applies:

- Maximum tax (refund cap) of \$150.00/sale.
- No vendor compensation for permit holders.
- Limited exemption for contractors does not apply.
- Tax imposed applies to contract bids submitted on or after effective date.
- New Farm Machinery is exempt.

The North Dakota Office of State Tax Commissioner has contracted with the City of Minot to administer the city sales, use, and gross receipts tax. Tax is computed by multiplying the taxable purchase amount by the tax rate and carrying the product to the third decimal place. If the third decimal place is five or greater, round up; if it is four or less, round down. A local tax guideline is available at [www.tax.nd.gov/guidelines](http://www.tax.nd.gov/guidelines).

Effective October 1, 2026, the combined state and city rates within the city limits of Minot will be as follows:

- General sales and use tax: 8% (5% state + 2.5% city + 0.5% county)
  - New farm machinery and farm irrigation equipment: 3.5% (3% state + 0.5% county)
  - New manufactured homes: 6% (3% state + 2.5% city + 0.5% county)
  - Lodging:
    - o Hotel, motel, and tourist court accommodations and bed & breakfast accommodations licensed under North Dakota Century Code Ch. 13-09.1:
      - 8% (5% state + 2.5% city + 0.5% county)
- \*\*Please note:** The City of Minot does impose a local lodging tax; however, these taxes are administered by the city. Please reach out to the City of Minot for additional information.
- Restaurants, concession stands, and mobile food trucks (sale of food and non-alcoholic beverages):
    - o 8% (5% state + 2.5% city + 0.5% county)
  - Alcoholic beverages:
    - o Off-sale alcoholic beverages: 10% (7% state + 2.5% city + 0.5% county)
    - o On-sale alcoholic beverages: 10% (7% state + 2.5% city + 0.5% county)
